Dr Jeleen Briscoe-Reitz of the University of Penn Veterinary School of Medicine came to the club and spoke to us about the test results from her study in 2005. In her findings, she has discovered the stapholococcus bacteria on some our birds. Apparently, we are the ones who pass this onto our birds, through handling, kissing, and other contact. So we would like to once again stress that **hand cleaning** is very important and will help reduce the transmission of 'bugs' to our loving pets.

Prepare A Bird Carrier and Evacuation Kit Have a bird carrier and bird emergency ready

Every year we hear sad stories from pet bird owner's who have experienced an bird emergency requiring evacuation from one's home. Whether it be hurricanes, tornado's, earthquakes, floods, or even a terrorist attack, every bird owner should have a bird travel cage for each bird and develop a plan to take care of their parrots when water and electricity are not available.

Planning ahead, preparing an emergency kit and practice are the keys to a fast, safe and efficient evacuation during emergencies. We suggest that you purchase a medium sized Rubbermaid or similar brand plastic tub which has a sealing lid to place your parrot emergency items in. Label the tub and place it in a location with your bird carriers. Also, have your parrot's bird carrier assembled and labeled with your birds name, your telephone number and your veterinarian's telephone number in plain view. Be sure that you have written "REWARD IF RETURNED TO OWNER" on the carrier, as well.

Develop a plan of how you would get your parrots to safety and practice a simulated evacuation. Call your veterinarian ahead of time and request permission to have your parrots boarded with him/her if your parrot is lost and found by emergency personnel. We've compiled a list of minimum requirements for pet bird evacuation. Packing enough supplies for 5-7 days should be sufficient in most cases.

Each parrot should have a specific bird carrier assembled and ready should an evacuation be necessary. Prepare labels with permanent ink to place on each bird carrier with the following information on each:

- Parrots Name
- Owner's Name, Address and Telephone Number
 - Emergency Contact Name and Telephone
- Veterinarian's Name, Address and Telephone Number
 - REWARD WHEN RETURNED TO OWNER

If you only have a few pets, place the label on the bird travel cage ahead of time. If you have several pets, it will be easier to have the label's prepared ahead of time and placed in a location near your bird travel cage. Apply the proper label to the bird's travel cage as you place your parrot inside.

Bird Carriers and Emergency Bird Supplies

In the wake of recent disasters, we've become increasingly aware of being prepared to evacuate our home in case of an emergency. Don't wait until the last minute to evacuate if you have animals. Once the disaster is imminent, if the only way out is by official rescue transport, emergency officials may not allow you to take your pets when they rescue you.

Pack necessary bird supplies early. Prepare an **Emergency Bird Supplies Kit** and keep items in an accessible place. Store your bird supplies in sturdy containers that can be easily accessed and carried (duffle bags, covered trash containers, etc.). You should stock your pet disaster kit with the bird supplies identified on the left.

Plan Ahead. Scout out temporary pet-friendly living quarters (motels, friends, relatives, boarding facilities, veterinarians) in outlying areas ahead of time. **Have a stash of cash.** Credit cards cannot be processed when the electricity is out, and checks might not be accepted.

Prepare your Parrot, too. Get your parrot groomed at the start of storm season. And, make sure your bird is familiar with its travel cage. Train your parrot to wear a <u>bird harness</u> if possible.

Take time to consider everything you would need for your birds if you had to leave your home on short notice. For example:

A portable carrier for each bird
Supply of food and water
Toys to help relieve the stress of an unusual situation
Bird first aid kit
Cleaning supplies
Medications

Have you considered identification for your birds? Talk to your avian vet about microchips. Think of all the important information about your birds and keep it together. **If you couldn't care for your birds ~** would someone else know how? Suppose your bird was lost ~ what would help your search?

You may want to give a duplicate file to a trusted friend or relative. Some suggestions to include are:

Names (of course!)

Description of your birds / colors / unique markings

Identification numbers

A recent picture of each bird

Feeding schedule / Food preferences

Health records / Medications

Favorite words, phrases or songs

Contact list ~ family, friends, veterinarian, local bird rescue

Any Animal, Any Disaster, Anywhere

The Pennsylvania State Animal Response Team (PASART) was created through a private-public partnership to serve as a unifying network of organizations, businesses, federal and state government agencies, and individuals that supports the prevention, preparedness, response, and recovery for emergencies affecting animals.
