
### WHY PET BIRDS NEED REAL FOOD!

- 1. Budgies have been known to live 25 years in the wild, 7-10 in our cages, dying from illness secondary to slow starvation.
- 2. Seed is a carbohydrate almost devoid of nutrients, often fatty. Okay to 25% of diet (to work for food: relieve boredom).
- 3. *HIDDEN MALNUTRITION*...birds will pretend to eat the day before they die to fool predators.
- 4. Per ASSN. of Am. Feed Control Officials, "It is deceptive and misleading to make total diet claims for avians other than poultry."









veggies/fruits: peppers, carrots, papaya. Whole grains, pasta, brown rice.

PROTEINS: lean meat, poultry, well-cooked eggs, soy tofu-increase when moulting. Crazy Corn's 50 Irresis-Table Foods; a few nuts-more for macaws






