ABOUT THE BAND

Leg bands are informative. A round, stainless steel band, with an incomplete circular closure is a quarantine band. These bands are known as “open” bands. The split is where it was bent to form a circle around the leg of the bird. It has letters and numbers, for example, AGC289. The letters identify the quarantine station receiving the birds within the United States. The numbers identify which bird in the imported group wears that band. These bands are applied to the wild caught birds when they enter the United States via one of many avian quarantine stations. Quarantine bands are applied by the USDA, and are carefully tracked. Such tracking is important, for in case of a disease outbreak, the USDA needs to be able to locate all exposed birds quickly. You can contact your local United States Department of Agriculture, Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service office. They are very helpful and responsive to disease inquiries. These bands are very tough, and difficult to remove, so most quarantine birds keep their bands for life.

A “closed” band means that the band is solid, with no splits in the band. Welded closed bands are applied to baby birds, and usually indicate hand raised babies of captive bred birds. These closed bands are slid on over the foot of the baby bird before it is full-grown. These bands usually have letters and numbers identifying the breeder. If the band includes the letters “NCS”, “ACS”, “ALB”, “SPBE”, or “AFA”, these bands are easily traceable. Other codes may be private codes used by breeders to keep track of genetics of lineage. Breeder band identifications can be traced through local and national bird clubs and organizations for they have records showing who raised particular birds. Your local avian veterinarian or pet shop is another good place to search in an attempt to track a breeder band. Always record your bird’s band information for future use when needed.

Each breeder has their own preference as to how they like the bands to fit. Some like them to fit loosely, others prefer a close fit. Birds of the same kind can vary and some breeders band a little later with a larger size than one that would fit at an earlier age. All this should be taken into consideration when choosing a band size for your bird.

Leg bands can be purchased through parrot societies and popular companies such as L & M Bird Leg Bands, Inc. Use a search engine (i.e. google) and the choices are there for you to decide which band will be the best for your birds.



The Derbyan Parakeet is also known as the Lord Derby's Parakeet or Derby's Parakeet.

Its calls in flight are raucous, loud and metallic sounding; also calls resembling that of crows and ravens. Contact calls carry some distance.

Their habitat is found in highland forest from 2700-4000m (8856-13,120 ft). They have been seen in coniferous or mixed Pinus and Quercus forest, also from alpine Rhododendron growth areas. There have been also reported in cultivated valleys at harvest.

World Population has not been recorded and their longevity is 15 to 20 years. Breeding is limited, almost uncommon in captivity.

As far as pet suitability, the Derbyan Parakeet is highly intelligent, and a bit shy. Avid wood chewers and they may mimic human speech. They may also be loud at times.

Small numbers are captured in international wild bird trade; making this bird locally threatened (Sichuan).

Sonny – male Orange Winged Amazon

Sonny came from a very loving family who experienced a major lifestyle change, and were forced to find a new home for Sonny. He is a very friendly bird who steps up easily and loves to cuddle. He gets along with other birds once he gets used to them. He is relatively quiet and enjoys his time out of his cage.

Buddy – 14 YO male Lesser Sulphur Crested Cockatoo

Buddy seems to be a good natured bird who craves human contact. He has been mistreated, however, and bites out of fear. In recent weeks, he has come to trust people and allows petting of his beak, chest, head and legs through the cage bars. His behavior remains unpredictable, however, and he would do best in a home with a seasoned bird owner, where he will receive consistent love and attention.

Mango – 2 YO male Peach Front Conure

Mango is a young, friendly bird who loves fruit, especially dried papaya, and enjoys slowly destroying his wooden toys. He tends to bite your fingers when he steps up, but this is decreasing over time, and I believe he will be a good companion with consistent positive reinforcement from his caregiver. Mango can be a bit noisy, as with most conures, but does not scream excessively.

Roscoe – 10 YO male Nanday Conure

Roscoe is as charming as he is naked!! He has plucked his chest and back repeatedly, and feathers will most likely not grow in these areas. His remaining feathers are beautiful, however, and his tail is long, full, and gorgeous!! He is very friendly, loves a good head scratch, and has a sweet, low voice that sounds like a whisper. He plays vigorously with his toys, and screams for joy while doing it!

Lucky – male Nanday Conure with special needs

Lucky is a very gentle and sweet bird and has only one leg. How and when he lost his leg is unknown; however, he seems to have adapted well to his disability and gets around fine! His cage has been customized to his needs; to minimize injury from falling, but Lucky hardly seems to think he needs it! He can be quite vocal when he greets his family, and thoroughly enjoys company.

Bing – Cherry-Head Conure

Bing was removed from a bad situation and brought to the Bailey Foundation for help. He was plucked in spots, but his feathers have grown nicely and he is learning to trust people again. He says many words, and appears to want to be with people. He will mutter under his breath if people are nearby, but not paying attention to him. He will be a fine companion with patience and understanding.

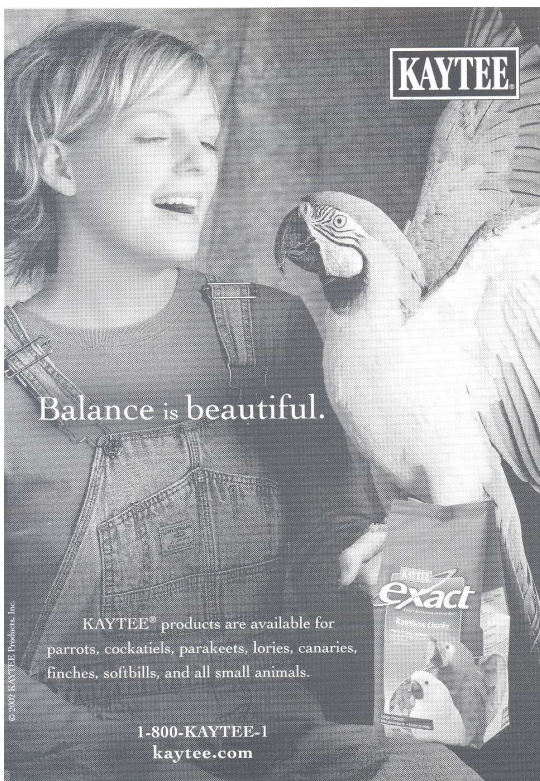

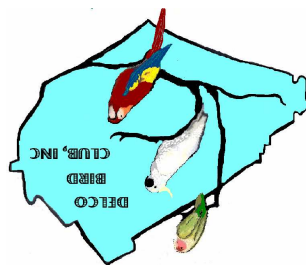
